A paper published in the *American Journal of Cardiovascular Drugs* cites nearly 900 studies on the well-established adverse effects linked with cholesterol-lowering drugs known as Statins. These adverse effects don't always surface immediately, so oftentimes they're not associated with the use of Statins.
